- The college conducted **2 national level seminars** online:
 1. The coordinator was the NSS team under the guidance of the NSS officer Dr. Leena Modi.
 2. A One day National Webinar on "Mutual Fund – Insights" was organized on 16 August 2020 in collaboration with National Institute of Securities Market, Mumbai'. 4 speakers were invited and 289 participants attended the webinar. It was coordinated by Department of Economics and Banking under the guidance of Mr. Azhar Khan.
- The college conducted 5 **Workshops** for the students:

One teacher completed a minor research project and post graduate certificate in teaching. Three junior clerks also attended workshops.**
- 30 widows & poor women received **financial assistance** worth more than a lac and **10 students received Scholarship from Indusind Foundation** through the efforts of our college. **15 students received scholarship worth Seventy Five Thousands from Jai Hind Trust.**
- This report cannot be complete without mentioning the names of our students who brought us laurels.
