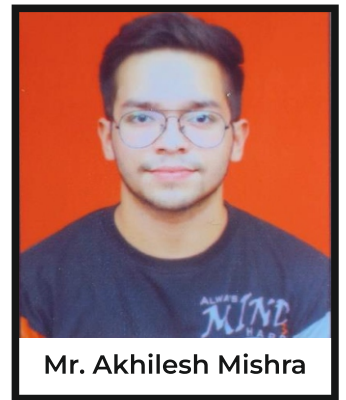
STUDENTS' ACHIEVEMENT

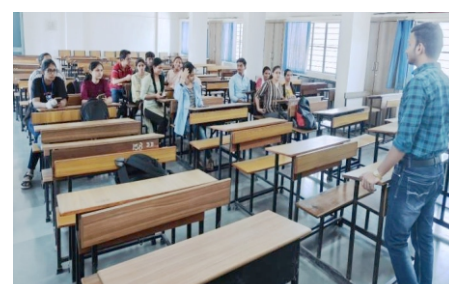


AI Fluency Course (Coordinator: Dr. Sanvidhan Sonawane)

ADD ON COURSES

Basic Course in EVS for S.Y. BBA

(Coordinators: Ms. Sonam Poptani, Mrs. Pallavi Chitken)

An Add-on Course titled “Basic Course in Environmental Studies (EVS)” was conducted for SYBBA Semester III students. The course was held from 20th September 2024 to 14th October 2024, with a total duration of 13 hours.

The course was conducted by Dr. Palak Chhablani, Ms. Sonam Poptani, Mrs. Ayasha Kanjan, and Ms. Ekta Kamble. It aimed to provide students with foundational knowledge of environmental science and to promote awareness of sustainable practices and ecological responsibility.

The topics covered during the course included: Introduction, Scope, and Importance of Environmental Studies; the Concept of Sustainability and Sustainable Development; an overview of Natural Resources, including their types and classification; and the structure and functions of Ecosystems. The course also explored Renewable and Non-Renewable Resources, Energy Flow in Ecosystems through Food Chains and Food Webs, and Levels of Biological Diversity.

This course served as a meaningful initiative to instill environmental consciousness among students and to equip them with essential knowledge on pressing ecological issues.



Ability Enhancement Course in Environmental Studies for S.Y. B.Com (Coordinator: Mrs. Pallavi Chitken)

The Ability Enhancement Course – Environmental Studies was conducted for SY B.Com students across Semesters III and IV. The course aimed to create environmental awareness and promote sustainability through a structured curriculum delivered in both online and offline modes.

For Semester III, the course was conducted from September 12, 2024, to October 18, 2024, and was successfully led by Asst. Prof. Pallavi Chitken. The lectures were delivered using a blended approach, combining online and offline sessions to maximize engagement and accessibility.

For Semester IV, the course ran from February 4, 2025, to March 19, 2025, in a fully offline format. Lectures were delivered by a team of experienced faculty and professionals, including Dr. D. B. Shirode, Dr. Deepa Nathwani, Adv. Preeti M., Mrs. Pallavi Chitken, Mrs. Purna Ugale, Mrs. Geetanjali Gaikwad, and Mr. Sanvidhan Sonawane.

By the end of the course, students developed a comprehensive understanding of environmental issues and their implications. They gained insights into the importance of the environment and the measures required for its protection, as well as the significance of maintaining ecological balance through the interaction of biotic and abiotic components. The course emphasized the adoption of renewable and clean energy sources and highlighted the concept and necessity of sustainable development. Overall, the course effectively enhanced students' awareness of critical environmental challenges, relevant legislation, and sustainable practices, thereby preparing them to become responsible citizens committed to contributing toward a greener and more sustainable future.

INDUSTRIAL VISIT

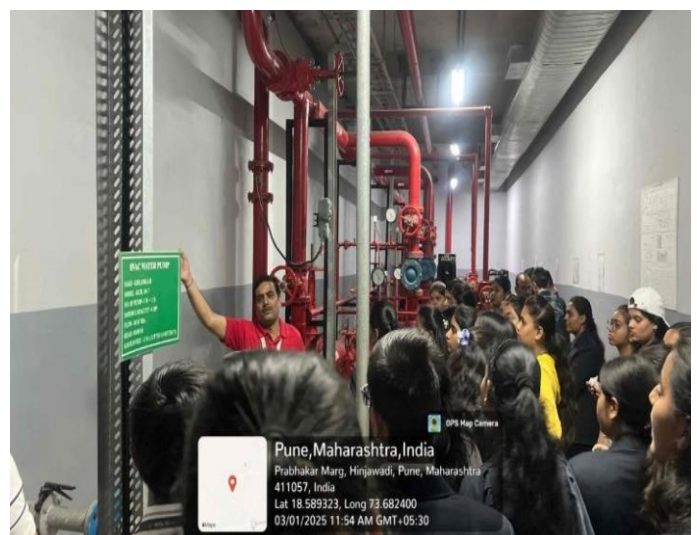

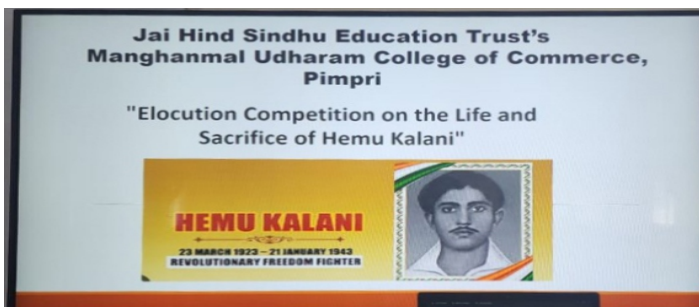

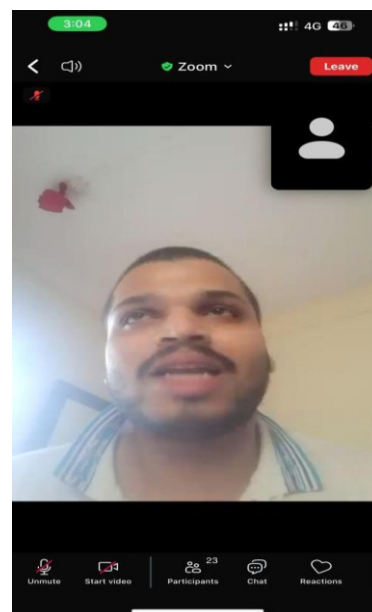
6. Celebration Of The Birth Anniversary of Savitribai Phule (03rd January, 2025)

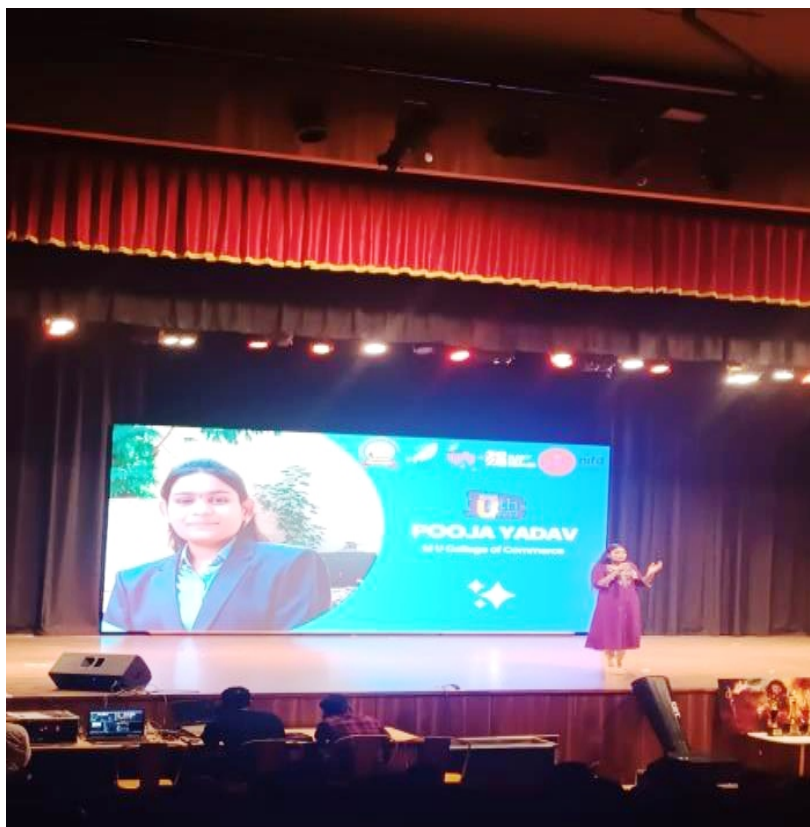




5) PCMC Youth Icon Competition

महात्मा गांधी: प्रत्येकाने स्वतःचा सफाई कामगार असावा.

02 ऑक्टोबर २०१४ रोजी भारताचे पंतप्रधान नरेंद्र मोदी यांनी महात्मा गांधी यांच्या जयंतीनिमित्त देशव्यापी स्वच्छता मोहीम सुरु केली. स्वच भारताची संकल्पना, प्रत्येक कुटुंबाला स्वच्छतागृहे, घाण आणि द्रव कचरा विल्हेवाटाची व्यवस्था, ग्रामस्वच्छता, आणि सुरक्षित आणि पुरेसा पिण्याच्या पाण्याचा पुरवठा, यासह स्वच्छता सुविधा प्रदान करणे आहे. राष्ट्रपिता महात्मा गांधी यांच्या १५० व्या जयंती निमित्त आदरांजली म्हणून २०२४ पर्यंत हे आपल्याला सध्या करायचे आहे.
